<p>The Sports Grant has had a substantial impact on pupils’ engagement in physical activity. We have broadened the sporting opportunities available, particularly through our partnerships with external providers and use of professional equipment. Participation levels increased, especially among our most vulnerable pupils and those with high needs, many of whom benefited from increased physical activity and structured sporting experiences.</p>				
<p>High-quality coaching from Fulham FC Foundation and access to community sports events supported skill development, motivation, and wellbeing. Access to swimming improved water safety awareness and helped pupils work toward national requirements. The funding enabled inclusive, consistent opportunities that promoted both physical and mental health benefits across the school community.</p>
